C O R R I G E N D U M

The following amendments are made to Ministry of Defence letter No.6(1)/81/D(Pension/Services) dated 12-7-1982 regarding permanent transfer of defence service officers to Public Sector Undertakings - grant of retiring benefits:-

Delete paras 2 and 3 and substitute them with the following:-

"2. The President has been pleased to decide as under:-

(i) where the service officer elects alternative(b) i.e. receiving DCRG and a lump-sum amount in lieu of pension, the payment of monthly pension will start from the due date(i.e. date of absorption) pending medical examination in accordance with the rules relating to commutation of pension.

(ii) The commutation shall become absolute and the title to receive the commuted value of pension shall accrue on the date on which the medical Board(authority) signs the medical certificate. If the medical board directs that the age of the officer for the purpose of commutation shall be assumed to be greater than his actual age, the officer concerned will have the opportunity to change his option for receiving a lump-sum amount in lieu of pension to receiving the monthly pension by written notice despatched within two weeks from the date on which he receives intimation of the findings of the medical board. If the officer does not change his option within the period of two weeks prescribed above he shall be assumed to have accepted the findings of the medical board (authority).

(iii) The reduction in the amount of pension on account of commutation would become operative(a) from the date on which the medical board signed the medical report in respect of cases arising before 11-7-75, and(b) from the date of receipt of commuted value of pension by the pensioner or 3 months after the issue of the authority by the Pension Sanctioning Authority asking the pensioners to collect the commuted value of pension whichever is earlier, in respect of cases in which the medical board is held on or after 11-7-75".
